We started last week reading the story, *Wonderfully Me* by Toyin Owoseje, in assembly. The children were very keen to reassure each other about what they would do if anyone was unkind to them. They confidently explained that they would tell an adult and were able to identify three trusted adults to talk to. We were especially impressed that the children also recognized that they can support their friends by encouraging them to speak to an adult or by telling an adult on their behalf. The children knew that if they saw anything unkind they should let a grown up know. It is so important that we all have responsibility for keeping each other safe and happy. 


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Sports Personality of the week!
